

National Aviary Welcomes Aurora

There is hope for love in the air as Kodiak, the Steller's Sea Eagle (Kody), is bonding with his new potential mate.

In the fall of 2023, the arrival of a female Steller's Sea Eagle prompted unprecedented support from the community when all were invited to vote on the possible names for the magnificent new addition to our flock. After several weeks of online voting, and with more than 12,500 votes and \$14,000 in donations, she was named **Aurora**!

Steller's Sea Eagles are found throughout Russia, South Korea, Japan, and China. They are listed as Vulnerable to extinction by the International Union for Conservation of National Aviary Welcomes Aurora Nature (IUCN). Populations of these large, majestic birds are currently

declining in the wild, with fewer than 5,000 remaining. The National Aviary supports conservation efforts for this species by participating in the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) - collaborative breeding program. These programs ensure the entire Steller's Sea Eagle population remains healthy and genetically diverse for the long term.

Aurora and Kody have continued to acclimate with one another since her arrival and regularly show positive behavioral signs through vocalization and other behaviors. Kody has been busy collecting nesting materials to place on a perch they sometimes share in their habitat in The Charity Randall Foundation Eagle Hall. We remain hopeful that the pair will raise chicks in the future to boost the Steller's Sea Eagle population.

Visitors can take the flight of a lifetime on Birdly®, a virtual experience where guests can soar over a city or glide through the ocean like a penguin. Sexes of New African Penguin Duo Revealed!

Last fall, Patrick and her mate, Owen, hatched two African Penguin chicks here at the National Aviary, marking an additional spark of hope for a species that is increasingly experiencing population declines in the wild.

We recently shared the genders of this new African Penguin duo, growing quickly into full-fledge juveniles under the care of their parents in a behind-the-scenes habitat. The Aviary's expert veterinary staff sent their fully-developed feathers to a lab for DNA testing.

Weighing 6.97 pounds, hatchling one is a boy and weighing 6.35 pounds, hatchling two is a girl!

New Male Andean Condor Arrives

With immense wingspans that can reach up to 10 feet, few birds are more awe-inspiring than an Andean Condor.

In late February, the National Aviary announced the arrival of Bud, a male Andean Condor. Bud came to Pittsburgh from the Dallas Zoo and lived behind-the-scenes for several months, acclimating to his new space, before moving to a habitat in Condor Court alongside the Aviary's resident adult female, Lianni. At 43 years old, Bud serves as an ideal new potential mate for Lianni.

Andean Condors are listed as Vulnerable throughout their range in South America, and Critically Endangered in Ecuador and are increasingly declining in the wild. The National Aviary plays an important role in their

conservation through participation in the Association of Zoo and Aquarium's (AZA) Species Survival Plan® (SSP) for Andean Condors. Bud's arrival offers an important breeding opportunity for the conservation of their species. Three of Lianni's hatchlings in past years have been released into their native range within Colombia and Venezuela.

Lianni and Bud's bonding process is still in the developmental phase but the Aviary expert care team continue to see strong signs that the pair is acclimating well with one another. As the Andean Condor breeding season typically begins in early spring, we remain hopeful this pair will potentially raise a chick to boost their population within the next few years.



In Memory of Benito the Hyacinth Macaw

This past January, we said goodbye to one of the Aviary's oldest, and most beloved residents. Benito the Hyacinth Macaw. Benito came to us as an adult male in 1993, right before his claim-to-fame appearance on *Mister Roger's Neighborhood*.

Benito was extremely well-known and loved by all, including visitors and National Aviary staff, from our Executive Director to our newest Members. He was the ultimate jokester who loved to "wave" at everyone from his perch in the Tropical Rainforest. He could often be seen dangling from his beak and flapping his wings, which would always garner much attention from those around him. Benito passed away from an aneurysm, which can develop without symptoms with age in many species. We are incredibly grateful for the three decades he spent having a positive effect on everyone who had the opportunity to meet him at the National Aviary.
